- Must have a disability that creates a substantial barrier to employment.
- Must be between the ages of 14 and 24.
- Must meet at least one of the following:
 - Low-income
 - Housing insecurity
 - In foster care
 - Involved in the justice system
- Must attend services in person in Orange, Lake, or Osceola counties.
- Must be eligible to work in the United States.
