Eligibility:

- Must have a disability that creates a substantial barrier to employment.
- Must have at least one dependent child in the household (under age 18, or under age 19 if enrolled in secondary education).
- Household income must meet low-income requirements.
- Must attend services in-person in Bladen, Cumberland, Harnett, Hoke, Lee, Moore, or Robeson counties.
- Must be eligible to work in the United States.

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
